Accordingly, I have refused your request for the documents listed in the above table under section 18(d) of the Official Information Act 1982 on the grounds the information requested is or will soon be publicly available.

As outlined in the Cabinet Office <u>circular</u> on the Proactive Release of Cabinet Material (CO (23) 04), all Cabinet and Cabinet committee papers and minutes must be proactively released and published online within 30 business days of final decisions being taken by Cabinet, unless there is good reason not to publish all or part of the material, or to delay the release beyond 30 business days. However, due to further decisions that were pending and to enable external consultation, we were not able to publish the Cabinet paper within the 30 business day timeframe.

We will provide you with a link to the Cabinet paper, once this is published on our website.
