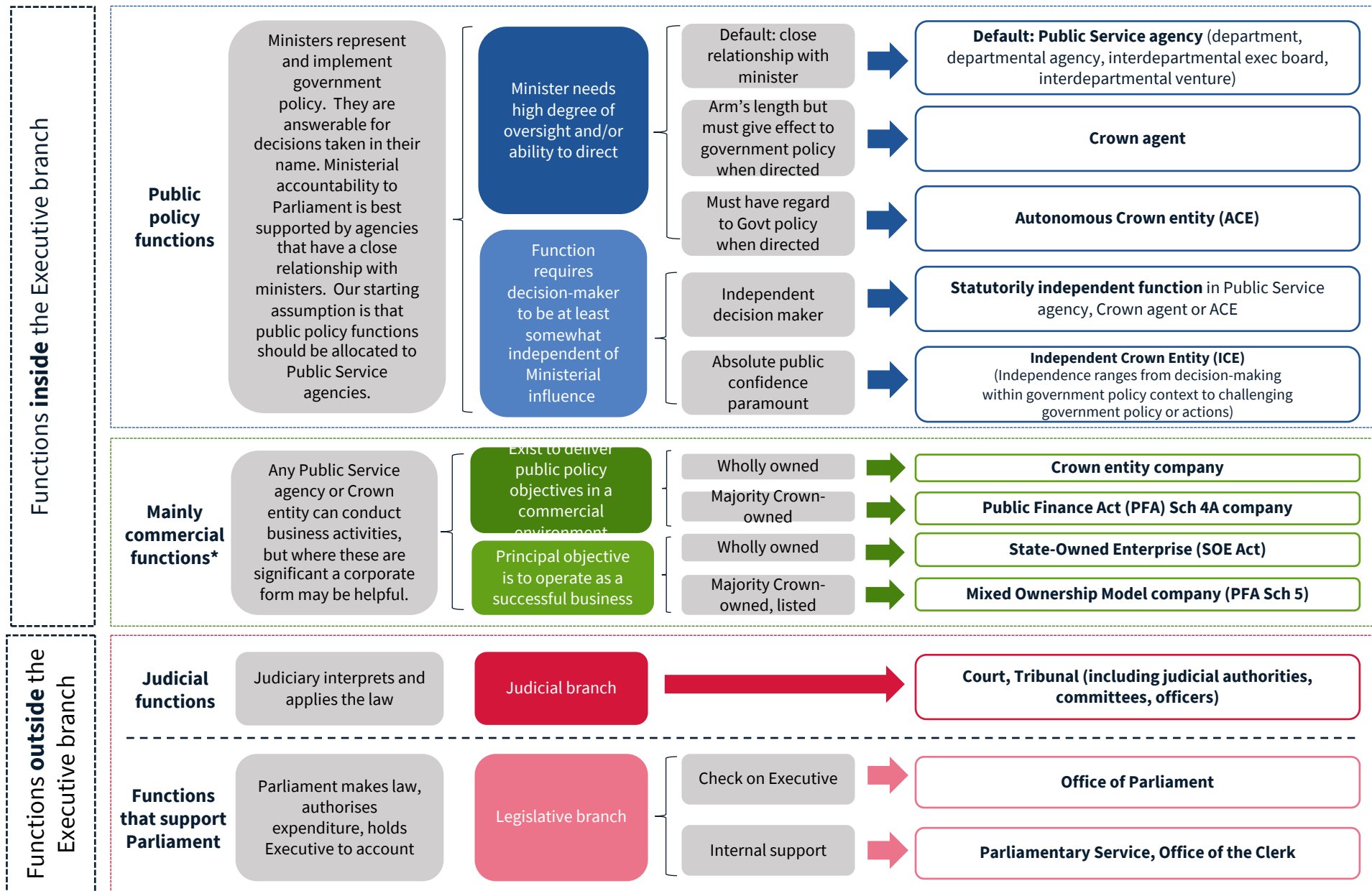




## Main organisational design choices



## Less common organisational design choices

### Organisation associated with a ministerial portfolio

Wide variety of statutory and non-statutory bodies that are not instruments of the Crown but are associated with a minister through board appointments, requirements to provide information etc (eg producer boards, professional bodies, NGOs undertaking statutory roles)

### Non-statutory board

Wide variety of non-statutory boards with different functions, powers, membership, appointment provisions and reporting responsibilities

- Advisory boards or stakeholder groups established to advise minister or chief executive.

### Joint venture

Public Service agencies include interdepartmental ventures and joint operational agreements. Many central government organisations are also involved in structured collaborations with local government, private sector and/or NGOs, often organised through a special purpose vehicle such as a company owned jointly by the participants.

### Public Finance Act Sch 4 organisation

These legacy organisations were exempted from many of the Crown Entities Act provisions when the Act was passed in 2004 because of their unusual nature or small size  
Eg Fish and Game councils, NZ Lottery Grants Board
