Executive Summary

- 1. This report provides you with data on the proactive release of Cabinet papers for the sixmonth period covering July to December 2023. The report includes a summary of the findings and limitations of the data. This is the third report generated since reporting was introduced by Cabinet in 2022.
- 2. Key results for the proactive release of Cabinet papers, with comparison to the previous reporting period, are:

- 3. Overall there has been a lift in performance with 81% of papers proactively released within policy (i.e. within 30 working days or after a delay envisaged the policy), compared to 76% in the previous reporting period. Overall 257 papers were proactively released, compared to 202 in the previous reporting period.
- 4. Reasons for delay in line with the policy include: national security, commercial, trade or travel sensitivities, public announcements or waiting for the introduction of a Bill. There can be many reasons why a paper that has been approved for release has not been released within the same reporting period. These are discussed in further detail below.

Purpose of Report

5. This report updates you on the number of Cabinet papers, by portfolio, proactively released within Cabinet policy in the July- December 2023 period.

Background

- 6. In May 2022, Cabinet agreed that departments report to the Public Service Commission every six months on the number of Cabinet papers released. The Commission reports this information, by portfolio, to you as the Minister for the Public Service [CAB-22-MIN-0168.01 refers].
- 7. <u>Cabinet Office Circular CO (23) 04</u> and Section 8.19 of the Cabinet Manual set out the requirements and procedures for the proactive release of Cabinet material, including reporting requirements. The circular provides examples of good reasons not to publish material including national security, privacy or commercial sensitivities. Reasons to delay release may include waiting for public announcements or for a Bill to be introduced.
- 8. The 30-working day release period results in data on a rolling basis. This is because papers are approved, prepared and released by agencies on various timelines. Consistent with past reporting, we have focused our analysis on papers that have been both approved and released within the July December 2023 period.
- 9. A breakdown of the statistics by portfolio is provided in **appendix one**. There are several limitations on the data, including the reasons why a paper may not have been released and the lag between approval and release. These limitations are discussed further below.

Observations

10. The July - December 2023 data collection, shown in Table 1, is the third time data has been reported. The first reporting period covered July - December 2022. Collections continue at six-monthly intervals alongside existing Official Information Act data collections.

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 Table 1: July - December 2023 proactive release summary performance data

11. The data shows:

- a. An overall improvement in performance: 64% (257) of papers were released compared to 42% (202) in the previous 6 months.
- b. A high proportion of papers were released within policy (i.e. within 30 working days or published following a delay envisioned by the policy): 209 papers (81%) of the 257 papers released.

c. An improvement in the number of papers released within 30 working days (without delays): 69% (177 of the 257 papers released) compared to 61% in the previous reporting period.

Limitations

- 12. The 'rolling' nature of the data through each reporting period and the exceptions under the policy present challenges for agencies with tracking, recording and reporting of data.
- 13. There are a range of legitimate reasons under the policy for why a paper may not have been released within the 30-working day window, as set out above. There can also be a lag due to release being deferred for a reason under the policy, or the 30 working day period extending across two reporting periods. For example, a paper that was considered by Cabinet after 13 November 2023 would be recorded as a paper that has been approved for proactive release but may not have been released by 31 December 2023.
- 14. In addition to the papers captured in this reporting period, a further 171 papers from previous reporting periods were also released within July to December 2023. Unfortunately, no data on whether these papers were released within the policy is available. We intend to explore with agencies how we might be able to address this data gap in future.
- 15. We will continue to work with agencies to improve the data quality and anticipate further improvements as the data collection process matures.
